Rogers took a special

When they reached the top and looked out over all the mountains and the big blue sky, Adrian felt very small. He wondered how big God must be to create not only this mountain, but the whole world?


He asked his mom, "If God created you and me and this whole world, but we can't see God, how do we know He is there?"

"I'll start!" Adrian said, jumping up and down happily! He picked the first two wildflowers, threw them into the air and said,



# A IS FOR ALPHA.


God was here in the beginning, before the sky and Earth had form. He was here first before all people and before you were born.

"In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth."

**GENESIS 1:1** 

**Devotional:** God was here first! He was here when there was nothing but darkness—before anything or anyone was created on this Earth. He always was here and always will be here. That's hard to imagine, right? Some things we can't understand, and this is definitely one of those things to ask God about one day in Heaven. Think about a world that was dark, without sunshine or trees or people. God brought it to life! The Bible tells us in Genesis 1 that God took great delight in His creation and called all that He made, "good," with His most special part of creation being us... men, women, boys, and girls. You are special, and God has you on this Earth for a reason!

**Activity Suggestion:** Take a ball or hula hoop and toss it in the air to one another. Wherever your hand lands when you catch it, try to find the place on the ball or hula hoop where it starts and where it ends. Can you find it? No, because just like God, a circle has no beginning or end.



# B IS FOR BOUNDLESS.

God has no out-of-bounds place He cannot be. He can be everywhere at once, including here with me.

"The Lord looks from heaven; He sees all the sons of men."
PSALM 33:13

**Devotional:** When you play tag with your friends or sports with your team, there are always rules. You have to stay within a certain space to play and not go out of bounds, right? Or when you travel to visit your grandparents or go on vacation with your family, you can only visit one place at a time. This is why thinking about God being boundless is so hard to understand! He can be EVERYWHERE at the same time. God has no out-of-bounds place; He has no limitations. If I traveled around the world to China and you stayed here, He would still be able to hear my prayers and your prayers at the SAME time! He holds the WHOLE WORLD IN HIS HANDS and can meet every need, because God is boundless.

**Activity Suggestion:** Learn the motions and sing "He's Got the Whole World in His Hands" together. If you have a globe, spin and land your finger on a spot, and say, "No matter where I go in the world, God is there!"



# C IS FOR CREATOR.

God is the great artist who makes every shape and color in the world. He forms the mountains, paints the sunsets, and makes every boy and girl.

"For by Him all things were created that are in heaven and that are on earth."

COLOSSIANS 1:16A

**Devotional:** God made EVERYTHING! When you look around, you can see that God loves design and loves color. He made people in all different colors, shapes and sizes; He made trees, flowers and animals in all different colors, shapes and sizes. He is the FIRST original creator. All of the colors, materials and designs you see were originally designed by God first. Through the years, people have learned how to use those colors, materials and shapes to make other things, such the car you drive, the house you live in or the clothes you wear. God really is the GREAT God and the FIRST AND BEST Creator!

**Activity Suggestion:** Walk outside or look out the window. Point out as many different colors as you can in creation. Then move on to different shapes and sizes. Optional: Have a color and shape scavenger hunt outdoors. Start with the basic colors and shapes on a piece of paper and check them off as you find them, noting that this creation is God's.
